## TODAY'S VISITORS - TYNEDALE REC

Preston Grasshoppers entertain Tynedale today at Lightfoot Green and will want to both put last weeks dismal second half behind them and avenge what was their heaviest defeat of the season back in October in the North East.

It came as no surprise after the game at Lockwood Park that the Huddersfield Full Back was announced as the home side's Man of the Match, not the first present he was gifted that afternoon!

Looking forward to today's game, and the Tynedale game will be viewed as a possible 'W' by the Hoppers coaches, which can only be achieved if their charges stick to the game plan worked on throughout the build up.

Tynedale are currently sitting comfortably just below mid table with eight wins to their name and bring to Lightfoot Green a recent record which has seen them concede then score themselves fifty points in successive games. A fifty points to ten defeat at the Woodlands was followed last Saturday with a fifty four points to five victory over bottom side Scunthorpe on home soil.

Our visitors Tynedale first gained promotion to Level 4 in what was then National 3 North during the same season Hoppers were demoted from National 2 back in 2002.

The first meeting between Preston Grasshoppers and Tynedale was in Corbridge on the 9th of February 1980 after a game the previous season at Lightfoot Green had been cancelled. The victors that day were the home side by twelve points to three.

All told there have been twenty nine meetings between the two clubs plus a pre-season game at Lightfoot Green prior to the 2012/13 season, with a further five fixtures being cancelled including the proposed initial game. Currently Tynedale hold the upper hand with eighteen wins to Hoppers eleven. Amongst these there are twelve league wins to our opponents and just five to Hoppers with the spoils of the pre-season game going to Hoppers.

# FORMS PARTISON OF THE PARTISON

# HEAD OF RUGBY OPERATIONS Gareth Dyer welcomed our visitors this week and said

"Good Afternoon and a warm welcome to the players, coaches and supporters from Tynedale for today's National Two North fixture.

Tynedale have had a steady season to date and claimed some solid wins in tight games throughout the season. That ability to grind out wins is vital in this division given how tight the margins are between the teams.

Our January return was disappointing and should have been so much better given the position we got ourselves into during the last three games.

However, we have not turned those positions into results and that is proving costly.

Clearly we are deep in trouble at the wrong end of the table and last weekend's second half performance was beyond disappointing. Leading at half time we looked in good shape to go on and win the game but our second half display was abject.

The game plan that had worked in the first half seemed to go out the window and there can be no excuse for the implosion after half time. The players were given a clear game plan to play to and the reasons that we went away from that can only be answered by them. It is fair to say that they were left in no doubt about their performance at the final whistle. I have never been so disappointed by the collective mentality of a team I have involvement with.

Yes, confidence is low and yes we continue to be dogged by injuries but I cannot accept that either of those factors was behind some of the decisions that were taken during the game or our continued inability to defend properly.

So, on behalf of the team I want to apologise to the supporters who travelled last week. That second half display was not acceptable. The challenge now is to get a reaction. Now it's a case of turning up. Clearly I want to see the group roll up their sleeves and put right the wrongs that were clearly explained post match last week. If there are those who want to turn up their noses to that or worse, don't turn up at all then that will tell me all I need to know about their mental strength and how much they want to pull on the shirt in the future.

There remain 50 points to play for but we have got to stop beating ourselves if we want to start beating others."

## HEAD COACH Paul 'Arnie' Arnold had this to say this week

"Firstly I'd like to welcome the Tynedale coaches, players and supporters to Lightfoot Green this afternoon.

I'd like to start by saying we were all very disappointed with last week's result and the result against Wharfdale the week before. We know exactly where we are in the table and last week's performance in the second half wasn't acceptable.

Me, my backroom staff and players will not be throwing in the towel just yet. There are still 50 points up for grabs before the end of the season and we all know how important today's result is if we have any chance of survival in Division 2 North.

Again I'd like to thank all the fans who come week in week out to support the team.

I know this season hasn't quite been what everyone had hoped for, but trust me when I say that everyone who pulls on a Hoppers shirt cares and is trying their hardest out there on the field.

On the injury front, the news has broken about PJs retirement and I'd just like to say as his coach and friend that he has been a fantastic and inspiring leader on and off the field and he will be sorely missed every week by all of us. At least he's now got his commentary career to fall back on. Up the Hoppers."

# MINI JUNIOR AND COLTS RUGBY AT LIGHTFOOT GREEN

In terms of registered players, 2018/19 saw 400 plus youngsters enjoy the rugby experience at Hoppers. Not only did the number of volunteer coaches and managers increase by 20%, but also there was a planned and effective focus on achieving the England Rugby Coaching Award. This in itself is a tremendous platform for future growth. Two Junior age groups with high numbers played double fixtures throughout the season, thereby ensuring all youngsters enjoyed game time.

The Artificial Grass Pitch, entering its fourth year, has proved to be an invaluable asset, not only allowing more rugby to be played by an increasing number of youngsters but also leading to improved management of the grass pitches. The RFU now appreciates the challenge of providing mid-week training for over two hundred youngsters and has arranged for the club to pre-book two hours on the AGP every Wednesday evening. This represents a tremendous concession and can only lead to an improved standard of Junior Rugby here at Preston Grasshoppers.

The Colts demonstrated tremendous team spirit throughout the season, which culminated in a successful end of season tour to Bristol. Several of the ex-Colts are currently enjoying pre-season training with the first and second team squad. 

### 6 NATIONS PREVIEW - HEAD OF RUGBY OPERATIONS - GARETH DYER



This weekend sees the start of the 2020 Six Nations Championship. As ever the tournament will be eagerly anticipated by supporters but as in previous post World Cup tournaments, some teams will suffer a hangover whilst others will be determined to build on their showing in Japan or put right the wrongs of a poor performance. In 2008 and 2016, Wales and England won Grand Slams after poor World Cups the previous autumn.

All teams will be starting a fresh new four-year cycle to the next World Cup so throughout the next four years there will be one eye on development whilst trying to ensure results remain positive. So what should we expect from each team over the next two months?

#### **ENGLAND**

After reaching the World Cup final, England start as favourites particularly given they face Ireland and Wales at Twickenham. Eddie Jones has freshened up his coaching staff with

the additions of Amor and Proudfoot and the squad has also been changed with a number of new faces involved.

However perhaps Jones could have been even more robust with his selections, particularly at scrum half where England still seem to be lacking a bit of X Factor and also at Number 8 where once again Billy Vunipola is ruled out. It will also be interesting to see who of the new caps actually get any game time come selection.

The Six Nations is always a momentum tournament so the first weekend is always important. Playing away in Paris against a youthful but powerful home team may not be the place to introduce a number of new caps but go with the tried and tested and then look to introduce new faces once a winning start is secured.

Minimum Return: For England given their resources, any season without a Championship win is a poor return. England need to show the Semi Final performance is a regular standard rather than a flash in the pan. Their set piece also could do with a shot in the arm after their struggles in the final.

#### FRANCE

The game in Paris could be a huge opportunity for France. They had a steadily improving World Cup and with a new coaching team they have put their trust in youth. Given that France have been very prominent in recent Junior World Cups that seems a statement of intent and they are clearly looking long term having jettisoned a number of senior players. If Shaun Edwards can add discipline and a watertight defence to a side loaded with talented footballers then they could be the real deal after many years of false dawns.

Minimum Return: Three wins would hint at progress, four wins would suggest something special is building.

#### WALES

I like the look of the Wales squad and that there seems to be a move towards a more Welsh style of play under Wayne Pivac. Clearly this won't happen overnight but there are some outstanding footballers in the Wales squad who have been constrained by a one dimensional style of play for too long. I expect the likes of Tipuric, Adams, Liam Williams et al to reach a new level in attack. Some more ball carrying clout and a greater trust in letting the talents of Tomos Williams and Jarrod Evans have more game time would also hint that things are continuing to move in the right direction.

Minimum Return: Still have to strike the balance between winning and developing a greater attacking threat. Three home wins would be a solid return, four wins excellent but scoring far more tries would be the biggest improvement.

#### IRELAND

Ireland are an interesting one. The World Cup was a disaster and the appointment of a new Head Coach from within seems a gamble. A number of their senior players have had a poor twelve months and despite having glittering careers perhaps have something to prove. The Irish regions continue to do well in Europe but are the likes of Conor Murray, Jonny Sexton, Peter O Mahoney and Cian Healy have to show that their form in the World Cup was only temporary.

Minimum Return: The retention of many of the old guard adds to the pressure. They need to be in contention going into the final round to justify their favour.

## SCOTLAND

Scotland need to find some wins or time might start to look up for Gregor Townsend. Defensively they are far too porous and that is the major issue that needs to be addressed if they are to win games. Attacking wise they seem to be capable of scoring tries but the untimely spat between Finn Russell and coach Townsend hints of deeper issues and shorn of their playmaker, their defensive improvement needs to be instant.

Minimum Return: Beating Italy alone is not enough. Given the off field issues, a minimum of three wins and two competitive showings in defeat would seem to be the minimum to keep the Scottish support on board.

#### ITALY

Italy have a new coach in Franco Smith who has a good track record in making teams greater than the sum of their parts. He will need to be able to make good on that if he is to end a dreadful run of Six Nations defeats for the Azzurri. Two away games to start in Cardiff and Paris would seem to make this even more difficult but in post World Cup seasons, those teams who fared worst at the global tournament sometimes have a greater edge in their Six Nations performances. The long suffering Italian fans will be praying that is true for their team. Minimum Return: It has to be firstly getting a win then ideally another. Two wins would be a huge return given recent seasons.
